The multiple motorsport champion, Andrew Ranger, has accepted the GPSV organization's offer. Well-known in the stock car world, Ranger is much more than a car racer. For the past ten years, the Roxton Pond athlete is also an ambassador for BRP.

Andrew Ranger was the first winner of the spiked motorcycles when the discipline returned to the Circuit Yvon Duhamel in 2003. He repeated the feat in 2007, following a great duel with Dominic Beaulac #30. Ranger participated in the 2013 media race with an X3 machine (CAN-AM) and rode a Speed STR car for a demonstration race during the same year.

Being involved in motorsports from a very young age, accompanied by his experience as a racer and his love of the public, Ranger is without a doubt an excellent spokesperson for the GPSV. The 36-year-old has strong family values and a sense of belonging with Quebec companies. Since last year, Ranger has been driving one of Pinty's NASCAR cars for the Paillé Group of Berthier.

Ranger will be at the Grand Prix with family and close friends to experience the excitement of the 40th anniversary of the GPSV.
